Bamburgh	The place where Grace is buried along with her family.	<b>September 1838 – Grace Darling orchestrated the rescue of the survivors of the Forfarshire boat crash.</b>	
Heroine	A woman admired for her courage	<b>November 1838 – Queen Victoria rewards Grace Darling</b>	
Wreck	Something that is badly damaged.	<b>1842 – Grace Darling dies and is buried in Bamburgh</b>	
Rescue	To be saved from a dangerous situation.	<b>1880 – Grace Darling's True story is published.</b>	
survivors	To remain alive after an event.	<b>1938 – Museum opened dedicated to Grace Darling</b>	
Storm	Strong winds, rain, thunder and lightning.		
shipwreck	The remains of a ship that has been badly damaged or that has sank to the bottom of the sea.
