Subject Specific Vocabulary

Press	To use an even pushing force from one surface to another.
Transfer	Move from one place to another.
Pattern	A repeated decorative design.
Technique	A way of carrying out a certain task, especially artistic work.
Surface	The outside part or layer of something.
Impression	A copy (usually repeated)
Rolling	Moving/transferring an image by turning over
Rubbing	An impression of a design on brass or stone, made by rubbing on paper laid over it with coloured wax, pencil, chalk, etc.
Stamping	Impress a pattern or mark on (a surface, object, or document) using an engraved or inked block or die.

Materials for Printing

1	Roller – used as printing tools to roll press an image onto a surface
2	Stamps – carved and used as a press (can be made from fruits and vegetables)
3	Coloured Wax – found in crayons with a thick, stickiness perfect for rubbing images
4	Chalk – powdered and sensitive to surface change as it crumbles easily
5	Paint – used to cover the surface thinly and evenly
6	Paper or fabric- the canvas or base to put the prints onto
7	String patterns – examples of repeated shapes
